#### Romans 8:29-30

For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brethren; and these whom He predestined, He also called; and these whom He called, He also justified; and these whom He justified, He also glorified.

# Day 1

Read: Romans 7:1-6

**Introduction:** Notice the first word in Romans 7:1—"or". Romans 7:1 connects back to Romans 6:14—"sin shall not be master over you" because the law is not your master. In fact, Christians are not bound to the law just like a woman is not bound to her husband once he passes away—she is free to remarry.

- 1. How were Christians made to die to the Law (4)?
- 2. Instead of being bound to the Law, how do we serve (6)?
- 3. Are we still bound to the Mosaic Law (6)?

# Day 6

Read: Romans 8:28-39

**Introduction:** Foreknowledge ~ God sets His affections on you from eternity past. Predestination ~ God sets your destiny (glorification) beforehand. Calling ~ God effectually draws you to Himself. Justification ~ God declares you to be righteous. Glorification ~ God will transform you into the image of His Son for all eternity.

- What are the 5 links that take us from foreknowledge to glorification (29-30)?
- 2. How do we know that God will freely give us all things (32)?
- 3. Can anything separate us from the love of Christ (35-36)?

# Day 5

Read: Romans 8:18-27

**Introduction:** Suffering helps us to anticipate future glory. In fact, all creation eagerly waits for redemption. The groaning and suffering that we face here in this life helps us to long for the day when we receive our glorified bodies.

## Day 2

Read: Romans 7:7-13

**Introduction:** After reading Romans 7:1-6, you may be tempted to think that the Mosaic Law is bad. But instead, the Apostle Paul clarifies that the Law is holy, righteous, and good.

- How do we know that this passage is not talking about laws in general, but about the Mosaic Law (7)?
- 2. How did the Apostle Paul begin to understand that he had broken the Mosaic Law (7-8)?
- 3. Does the Mosaic Law result in life or death (10)?
- 4. How does the Apostle Paul describe the Law (12)?

### Day 3

Read: Romans 7:14-25

**Introduction:** In this section, the Apostle Paul describes the real struggle that Christians face. We have a desire to do good, but we often do not do it. If we are truly dead to sin, then why do we continue to struggle with our sin? We continue to struggle with sin because we still have a sinful flesh until the day we die and receive our glorified bodies.

- If you struggle with sin and do the things you do not want to do, what does that tell you about your view of the Law (16)?
- 2. Why do we struggle to do good (21)?
- 3. How should we respond to this inner struggle (25)?

### Day 4

Read: Romans 8:1-17

**Introduction:** In the midst of our struggle with sin, the Apostle Paul reminds us that there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. In this chapter, we find 3 of the 6 reasons why the Christian will never face condemnation. 1) Christ fulfilled the requirements of the Law (1-4). 2) The Spirit is dwelling in us (5-13). 3) We have been adopted (14-17). 4) Suffering helps us anticipate future glory (18-27). 5) The purposes of God (28-30). 6) The love of God (31-39).

- 2. If someone is set on the flesh, how do they view God (7)?
- 3. How can you know that you have been adopted (15-16)?
